- 1. Add up the quality score given by each judge, so you end with two or three totals.
- 2. Average those totals, that is, add them, then divide by the number of judges.
- 3. Divide that average by the number of specimens in the case.
- 4. Divide that result by the highest possible score for a single specimen, usually either 10 or 100.
- 5. Multiply that by the quality points available (presently 70). That is the number you want.
- 6. Have a second person do the same procedure to confirm the result.
